Logline

When humanity's hunger for limitless energy slows Earth's rotation, the planet splits in two — one side scorched by eternal sun, the other frozen in endless night. Life survives only in a narrow twilight zone where civilizations rise, fall, and are reborn through the ages.

Premise

In 2040, the world faces the greatest energy crisis in history. A mysterious corporation, HeliosCorp, promises salvation with unlimited power. But their solution comes at an unthinkable cost: siphoning energy directly from Earth's rotation. As the planet grinds to a halt, humanity's survival depends on adapting to a twilight world.

Each season leaps forward in time — from collapse, to fragile settlements, to myth and legend, and finally to humanity's last stand ten thousand years later.
